Discussion:

Bicycle Queensland

Discussion:

Bill Loveday addressed the meeting in regard to BQ's current situation and future aims, after which he responded to a large number of questions and observations. Highlights included:

- BQ currently in period of rapid growth, plan for the next year is a strategic review, and a review of the rules
 of association, involving membership consultation.
- BUGS range in interests and activities from Social to Advocacy. BQ needs to "organically" develop BUGS;
 this objective is assisted by establishing cycle development and advocacy working groups, developing a
 BUG tool kit, looking for membership feedback.
- Concerned that "internal" difficulties and tensions within the cycling movement can reduce standing of BQ in stakeholder's eyes.

Questions

- o How does BQ see itself and see the role of BUGS Umbrella/peak role or BUG undertaking local issues?
 - Complex issue (BQ is peak org, but also wants involvement in BCC/SEQ issues due to leading edge role in cycling developments)
- Member input how about information from BQ to members so that people know what's going on?
 - o Fair comment, need 2-way flow of info

- o BQ's thoughts should be broadcast?
 - o Communicate more once issue is resolved
- o BUG Development Officer to attend BUG meetings?
 - o Yes, expect so.
- BQ has West End/Southside based BUG-like qualities; not familiar with rest of BNE area.
 - o Yes, only have few people, need local views.
- o Has the Development Officer started?
 - Not yet.
- o Any milestones and target dates to share?
 - Organisational restructure; rules review and strategic review to be completed by March 08
- Any moves to make BQ more inclusive: exclusivity has been a feature of BQ until now. Strategic review, while going on for some time, wasn't communicated to members until annual report how can a review be effective if it doesn't talk to membership?
 - Re: membership, have two new faces on committee. Re: Strategic review: stage 1 consisted of consultation with BQ staff, other cycling organisations, in order to get an idea of the current situation. Stage 2 will be a membership consultation.
- o When BQ adopts a position at odds with all other BUGS involved on an issue (or vice versa), how does BQ assign priorities? How can members get involved to get issues prioritised?
 - BQ flexible enough to bend in direction of political wind
- Currently no process to have input to review policy positions apart from AGM.
 - o Need more structure to input process is "a reasonable point of view".
- o How transparent is the BQ position/decision-making process?
 - o Role of management committee is not to negotiate positions internally or externally.
- o BQ Advocacy Priorities?
 - More people cycling and normalisation of cycling
