

Bicentennial Bikeway upgrade

Stages of work

The Bicentennial Bikeway is Brisbane city's busiest shared pathway and an important cycle and pedestrian link in the active transport network.

Brisbane City Council is progressively upgrading the Bicentennial Bikeway. To minimise the impact of construction work on all users, this work is being completed in stages.

- **Stage 1**, Cribb Street to Park Road, was completed in 2009.
- **Stage 2**, Lang Parade to Land Street, was completed in September 2010.
- **Stage 3**, Park Road to Lang Parade, has a detailed design prepared and Council plans to commence work on this stage in May 2011.
- **Stage 4**, Land Street to west of the Regatta Ferry Terminal, is under investigation with plans to upgrade this section of the pathway in 2012.

In addition, Council is currently undertaking work to upgrade east and west of the Hale Street bridge.

- **The Hale Street west** project extends from the Go Between Bridge and Cribb Street.
- **The Hale Street east** project is from the Go Between Bridge and the William Jolly bridge.

Council will also undertake work at a number of locations in South Brisbane to ensure that pedestrians and cyclists have safe access to and from the city while work is being completed on the bikeway upgrade projects.

While these upgrades are being completed there will be changes to access for pedestrians, roller bladers and cyclists.
