

Bicentennial Bikeway upgrade – Hale Street east

Construction access changes

Construction of the Bicentennial Bikeway – Hale Street east upgrade will commence in June 2011, with completion expected in early 2012, weather permitting.

The project involves upgrading and widening a section of the Bicentennial Bikeway from the Merivale Rail Bridge to the William Jolly Bridge.

During these works, the Bicentennial Bikeway will be closed to all users between the Go Between Bridge and the Makerston exit at North Quay.

All bikeway users must seek alternative routes for the duration of the works.

Suggested alternative routes:

- **Travelling from the city towards Toowong** – exit at the Ann Street Ramp and follow detour signs.
- **Travelling from Toowong towards the city** – travel across the Go Between Bridge and follow detour signs.

Please refer to the map for details of these suggested alternative routes.

Brisbane City Council is progressively upgrading the Bicentennial Bikeway, Brisbane’s busiest bikeway, between Toowong and the CBD to minimise the impact of construction on users.

This project is part of Lord Mayor Graham Quirk’s commitment to provide \$100 million in new bikeway infrastructure over four years. It is also part funded by the Queensland Government.
